The impact of COVID-19 on File Assembly (Archiving)

- The lockdown could have an impact on a firm's ability to comply with its policies and procedures in relation to the timely assembly of final engagement files.
- Assembly deadlines (per ISQC1 = 60 days after the date of the auditor's report) that fall within or shortly after the official lockdown period are most likely to be affected.
- In the current circumstances, additional time may be required to assemble final engagement files.
